Stray Arrows	Persons in the vicinity of Archery Range	Range is constructed in compliance with current rules and regulations Safety Netting is inspected by Qualified Instructor prior to use Safety “Exclusion” Zone is clearly marked off when the Range is in use Participants are supervised at all times by Qualified Instructor(s)	<b>Medium</b>
Slips, trips, falls	All Users	Area in and around Range is regularly maintained Archery Range is always under the control of a Qualified Instructor Minimum of one adult in addition to the Instructor is required at all times	<b>Low</b>
Improper use of Equipment	All Users	Archery Range is always under the control of a Qualified Instructor with at least one other adult Range layout means Instructor has clear view of all participants at all times Maximum of 4 persons to be firing at once	<b>Medium</b>
Equipment Failure	All Users	Equipment inspected by Qualified Instructor before use at every session Equipment inspected and signed back into store by Qualified Instructor at the end of every set of sessions	<b>Low</b>
Bad Weather	All Users	In Extreme Weather or High Winds the Instructor will stop the session if they deem it unsafe	<b>Low</b>
